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# Tackling health inequalities in Europe – What can the EU do to support the work done at local and regional level?

Health is a value in itself as well as a prerequisite for the achievement of the EU 2020 objectives of smart, sustainable and inclusive growth. People's health influences economic outcomes in terms of productivity, labour supply, human capital and public spending.

In many of the member states of the European Union, however, health inequalities are increasing. This is a joint challenge for society that needs to be addressed and tackled by all levels of government.

This seminar will focus on the role of local and regional authorities, the need to recognize the EU-level and its impact, possibilities and obstacles when it comes to tackling health inequalities in Europe.

Building on local and regional examples from Europe, the seminar will seek to identify and discuss how existing EU tools can support, as well as recognize and bridge the gaps between what is needed by the EU and what can be provided by local and regional authorities in tackling health inequalities.

The target audience of the seminar are decisions makers and officers in the European Parliament, European Commission and organizations representing local, regional and national authorities and organizations involved in public health, health promotion and sustainable development.
